- Hit the sales racks first: Especially when it comes to clothes, check out the clearance section first before looking at regularly priced items.
- Compare prices on e-books: For classes with reading lists, perhaps buying the electronic version of a book would be less expensive than purchasing a physical copy.

- Drivers, yield to pedestrians when crossing the road, be mindful of students and school crosswalks, and never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.
- Drivers, when the school bus lights are on and blinking and the stop sign is out, STOP! DO NOT PASS THE BUS!

In development news, the Paramount Westgate Apartments at 5712 Westgate Dr. will be a 258-unit luxury apartment community on the

6.46-acre site. The unit mix will be 10 percent studios, 46 percent one-bedrooms, 33 percent two-bedrooms, and 11 percent three-bedrooms.



Community amenities include a resortstyle pool, business center, hyperintegrated electric vehicle charging system, dog park, fitness studio, locker package system, seventh-story lounge and community event space connecting to the rooftop terrace, a clubhouse with pool and WiFi, and much more. Construction is expected to begin later this year with completion in 2024.

Near MetroWest, a 4.6-acre lot just northwest of the intersection of Hiawassee Road and Old Winter Garden Road is being considered for redevelopment as a mixed-use project. As reported by WFTV, an application was filed June 29 in Orange County to review plans to demolish the existing building at 10 N. Hiawassee Rd. and replace it with a 46,086-square-foot development with "assembly, retail and office uses," as well as parking, a lobby and covered walkways.
