
MetroWest Giving Hearts asks for donations to help at-risk children and their families find hope through faith, love and education at Edgewood Ranch.

## MetroWest Public Safety Offers Essential Tips for Holiday Safety

Keep your home secure and shop wisely this holiday season with these safety tips from MetroWest Public Safety.

#### **Holiday Home Safety**

- Secure Doors and Windows: Always lock all doors and windows, especially when leaving your home or before going to bed. Consider installing deadbolts and security bars for added protection.
- Install a Security System: Use monitored alarm systems and cameras. Display signs indicating your home is protected by a security system to deter intruders.
- Use Timers for Lights: Set indoor and outdoor lights on timers to give the impression that someone is home, even when you're away.
- Keep Valuables Out of Sight: Store expensive electronics, jewelry, and other valuables in secure locations away from windows.
- Maintain Your Property: Keep shrubs trimmed and yards tidy to eliminate hiding spots for potential burglars. Ask a trusted neighbor to collect mail and packages if you're traveling.

- Report Suspicious Activity: Contact the Orlando Police Department or local authorities if you believe you've encountered a scam.


#### **General Awareness Tips**
